### ***Fruit Salad—From the Elderberries Recipe Collection***

## Meet Jim from South Carolina...

Every afternoon for the past 10 years, 88-year-old Jim Freeman hears a knock at the door. A smile comes over his face as he walks to greet a volunteer from Mobile Meals, who is holding a warm, nutritious meal. Sometimes a nurse or a chaplain is there too—just to check on him. On his birthday, he receives a birthday card and cake.

Jim's wife recently passed away after a 22-year battle with Parkinson's disease. His two adult children have moved away. So it is just Jim and his dog, Brook, who occupy his home in Spartanburg, South Carolina.

Jim, like many of the 600 people served by Mobile Meals each day, lives below the poverty level. "I have no income other than my social security," he says. "When I crunch the numbers, I realize that without this [help] I would not eat the way I do."

As Jim ages, volunteers pay careful attention to his dietary needs—adding vitamins, limiting salts, increasing fluids—whatever it takes to keep Jim healthy and free from hunger. "We are feeding God's people," says Ralph Gillespie, a Lutheran volunteer. "And that's what ELCA World Hunger is all about."

In September 2011, the Resurrection Dance Theater of Haiti will be coming to the US. They will be in Racine for 4 days from Saturday, September 24 through Tuesday, September 27th.

St. Joseph's provides a home and helps raise young Haitian boys without a family or home. Many of the boys were former child slaves, which is one of the major problems in Haiti today. St. Joseph's family focuses on education and the arts (drumming, dancing, singing, and painting). RDTH travels around the US and Canada giving performances in order to raise money for St. Joseph's home.

## How can you help?

We are looking for volunteers to help with the planning, running of the events and transportation of the boys to help get them to performances.

We are in need of 4 host families to help with lodging and meals. Each host family will be asked to take in 2 boys each.

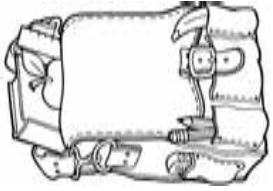

## News from the Holman's

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Thank you for your faithful prayers while we were in Nigeria! Our time there confirmed that we are recovering from our fatigue and stress. We handled most difficulties well, and we were often aware of your prayer support.

We made good progress in the translation work. Tom and "Isaac" were able to complete all that they needed to do for publishing Luke and for having the Jesus Film ready for approval. Isaac is now waiting for the "Lewami" Translation Committee to review and sign off on the script so that it can be recorded in November. **Pray** that the Translation Committee would fulfill its responsibilities in regard to this. Isaac is starting a degree program in Linguistics and Bible Translation at a college in Northern Nigeria this week (August 15). **Pray** that he would do well in the program.

Working in the Waja area by myself presented a few challenges. I wasn't feeling well the first two days, it was really hot and humid, and the project's unreliable generator "fried" one of the power strips, but we knew you were praying because everything sorted itself out. We were able to reach a point where the team could complete all the final checks of Luke on their own -- mostly the "jots and tittles" of spelling. They hope to finish and send it for printing in September, so keep praying, please!

Thank you for your faithful prayers and financial support. God works through your prayers to accomplish this ministry of Bible translation. We will be there with you the weekend of September 11, and we will bring a greeting at all the services. We hope to see many of you at church or at the potluck afterwards.

## ***Caring for Creation: Creating Our Nature Preserve***

Fifty years ago two congregations joined together to create our church. They bought additional land for future generations to develop. Now we have the opportunity to care for creation and our congregation by creating a nature preserve on the land that they purchased. Members of our congregation and our Green Team have met together to envision how best to utilize the land between our church's parking lot and Highway 31.

By creating a natural, outdoor chapel for meditation and worship as well as four teaching/learning areas for use by Sunday School, Confirmation, and adult Bible study classes joined by walking paths, we will create a beautiful outdoor area for all ages of our congregation to enjoy and in which wildlife will flourish. The areas that are not being utilized for paths or groups will not be mown, and native grasses, wildflowers, trees and bushes will provide shelter for birds, bees, and animals. Please check the design plans in the narthex for more information. This land will be developed over the years, with many members of our congregation participating and sharing their interests and expertise to create special areas such as a meditation garden, labyrinth, etc.

Soon the design will be marked and mown into the area. Then we will be able to walk the land to see how it will look and make any adjustments. Our next step is to plant trees to shade the four teaching areas and the natural chapel. Here is where everyone has an opportunity to help create a natural legacy for us and for future generations at Resurrection. A living, growing tree is a wonderful way to create a memorial to honor a loved one or to give thanks for all our blessings. If you are interested in helping to purchase a tree for the area, please stop in the Church Office and pick up the information.

All contributions, large and small, are welcome. Resurrection's Endowment Committee has stated that they will help fund, on a matching basis, all contributions for the preserve up to a total of \$2,500.00. Envelopes are available in the Church Narthex and from the ushers. We would like to get started by planting ten trees this October: two around each teaching pod and two around the chapel area. We hope that you will become involved in helping create a living legacy for future generations at Resurrection.

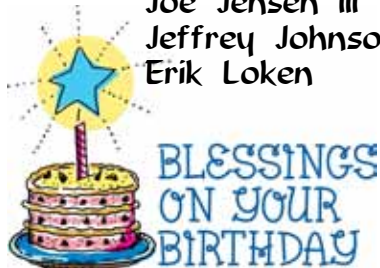
