**Nov. 16: *Wonder Girl: The Magnificent Sporting Life of Babe Didrikson Zaharias* by Don Van Natta**

This is the extraordinary story of a nearly forgotten American superstar athlete. Texas girl Babe Didrikson never tried a sport too tough and never met a hurdle too high. Despite attempts to keep women from competing, Babe achieved All-American status in basketball and won gold medals in track and field at the 1932 Olympics. Then Babe attempted to conquer golf. One of the founders of the LPGA, Babe won more consecutive tournaments than any golfer in history. A rollicking saga, stretching across the first half of the 20th century, *WONDER GIRL* is as fresh, heartfelt, and graceful as Babe herself. Author Don Van Natta is a national correspondent for the *New York Times*.

**Dec. 21: *Major Pettigrew's Last Stand: A Novel* by Helen Simonson**

Edgecombe St. Mary is a small village in the English countryside filled with rolling hills, thatched cottages, and a cast of characters both hilarious and as familiar as the members of your own family. Among them is Major Ernest Pettigrew (retired), the unlikely hero of Helen Simonson's wondrous debut. The Major leads a quiet life valuing the proper things that Englishmen have lived by for generations: honor, duty, decorum, and a properly brewed cup of tea. But then his brother's death sparks an unexpected friendship with Mrs. Jasmina Ali, the Pakistani shopkeeper from the village. Drawn together by their shared love of literature and the loss of their respective spouses, the Major and Mrs. Ali soon find their friendship blossoming into something more. But village society insists on embracing him as the quintessential local and her as the permanent foreigner. Can their relationship survive the risks one takes when pursuing happiness in the face of culture and tradition.

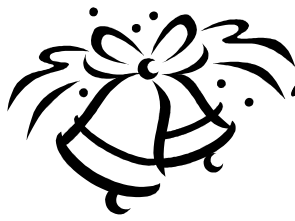
## *Meal Program Thank You*

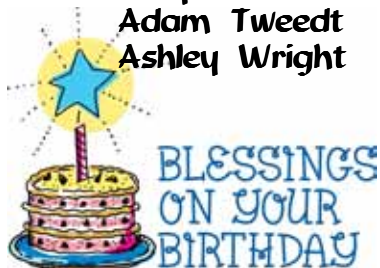

4# packages will be \$45.00

The Mt. Meru Coffee Project Objectives are to do Economic and Social Justice -- empowering the small coffee farmers and the people of the Meru region with the ability to improve their standard of living and escape the long standing cycle of poverty.
