**Oct. 19: *Hotel on the Corner of Bitter and Sweet* by Jamie Ford**

*Hotel on the Corner of Bitter and Sweet* is a historical fiction bestselling novel about the love and friendship of a Chinese boy and a Japanese girl during the Japanese internment in World War II on the West Coast of the United States. The story develops around the discovery in a boarded up hotel of belongings of Japanese families, left when they were rounded up and sent to internment camps.

**Nov. 16: *Wonder Girl: The Magnificent Sporting Life of Babe Didrikson Zaharias* by Don Van Natta**

This is the extraordinary story of a nearly forgotten American superstar athlete. Texas girl Babe Didrikson never tried a sport too tough and never met a hurdle too high. Despite attempts to keep women from competing, Babe achieved All-American status in basketball and won gold medals in track and field at the 1932 Olympics. Then Babe attempted to conquer golf. One of the founders of the LPGA, Babe won more consecutive tournaments than any golfer in history. A rollicking saga, stretching across the first half of the 20th century, WONDER GIRL is as fresh, heartfelt, and graceful as Babe herself. Author Don Van Natta is a national correspondent for the *New York Times*.

### ***Potato Lasagna—From the Elderberries Recipe Collection***

|  |                                    |
|--|------------------------------------|
| 1lb. Ground chuck                                  | 1 medium onion, thinly sliced      |
| 1/4 lb. mild bulk Italian sausage                  | 1-20 oz bad sliced Simply Potatoes |
| 1-19oz. Can Progresso Tomato Basil Soup            | 8 oz. shredded mozzarella cheese   |
| 1-14.5 oz. can diced Italian tomatoes, not drained | 4 oz. shredded Swiss cheese        |



Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Spray a 9x13 baking dish with non-stick cooking spray.

Brown the 2 meats until no longer pink.

Add the soup and tomatoes to the meat mixture and set aside.

Layer half of the potatoes and then half of the onion in the baking dish.

Put half of the meat mixture on the potatoes and onions. Sprinkle half of the mozzarella cheese on top.

Repeat the potato, onion, meat mixture and cheese layers.

Cover and bake for 1 hour.

Uncover and sprinkle on the Swiss cheese and bake 15 minutes uncovered

Let stand 10 minutes before serving.

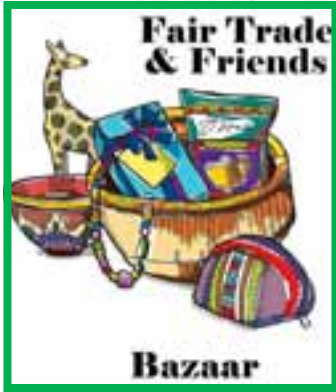

## Food Crisis in Africa Hits our Friends in Meru!

Our synod has received a troubling email from the Bishop of Meru, Tanzania addressing the critical food shortage that they are experiencing alongside their neighboring countries of Kenya and Soloia. It reads...

**From:** Meru Diocese of Tanzania

**Subject:** appeal for hunger relief

**To:** Dear Bishop Jeff Barrow of the Greater Milwaukee Synod

*Greetings in the precious name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Probably you have already heard about the appeals for assistance of food Aid in our area of East Africa (Kenya and Somolia).*

*It is very sad that this year again we are facing a critical food shortage in Meru. People worked very hard and planted crops on time, but as we are depending on rain, rains were not only unpredictable, but also insufficient. Crops germinated and were weeded, unfortunately at the flowering stage, rains stopped and we have no harvest in more than 3/4 of the Meru area.*

*Where irrigation is possible, we have pockets of food which is not even enough as water levels have gone down due to the lack of rain.*

*Market prices of maize now ranges between 50-75 \$/100kg sack, beans are thrice as much. Normally this time of the year, maize is sold at 15-20\$/100kg. Very few people can afford to buy food this year.*

*In Kenya also, and the rest of the Northern Parts of Tanzania situation is worse.*

*Oh behalf of the people of Meru we request you our sisters and brothers to help us again this year. We know that you are working very hard to help us, and we thank God always for your tireless support.*

*May God help us as we grow in partnership, to overcome the setbacks which are beyond our control together.*

## An Update on Resurrection's Nature Preserve

Our Nature Preserve is taking shape. The paths and areas for the outdoor chapel and four learning pods have been mowed. We invite you to "walk the land" starting at the southeast corner of the Preserve by the sign. A single path leads on a diagonal to the center line of the land and then splits into three paths: one straight to the chapel area and the other two, one to each side, to the learning pods. These two paths then join on the west side of the property. Please check the display in the narthex to see the overall design.

Now we are working on raising funds for buying shade trees for the chapel area and for the Sunday School, Vacation Bible students, confirmation students, etc., who will be using the four learning pods. We welcome your ideas for the selection and placement of the trees on the land as well as your contributions for purchasing them. The cost of trees range between \$200 and \$230 installed, and we would like to plant at least ten trees this fall. Envelopes for contributions of any amount are available from the ushers and in the church narthex. The Endowment Committee will match all the funds we raise up to \$2,500.00

Next spring we would like to plant more trees as well as native bushes and flowers to attract butterflies and other insects that will, in turn, attract birds, etc. Biblical flower, meditation, and teaching gardens and a prayer labyrinth are in our future plans. We will also be able to develop a natural prairie on the land.

Our trees will be planted in October, and we would welcome the help of congregational members of all ages in spreading the mulch around the trees and watering them. Resurrection's next fifty years and beyond will include a beautiful and useful nature preserve. We hope that you will become involved.

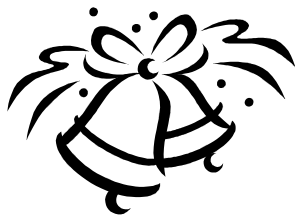
